How does school teach you to be safe at home?

Ring Childline / 999 if it's urgent
In assemblies – road safety, water safety, stranger danger
Electricity safety at The Crucial Crew

PHSE lessons - taking medicine safely / trusted adults/ we're taught about risks/ drugs and alcohol

Online safety – in lessons and in assemblies / tell an adult if something 'pops up' / Bullying / safety / scams

'Wigan lady' (Healthy Relationships Team) talked about filming without consent

Tell a teacher if someone (or something) at home makes us sad

If a friend told you that they were being sent messages and photos that were making them feel worried, could you, as their friend, speak to a member of staff?

Yes, because it's the right thing to do

Yes, because I don't want them to worry

Yes, because I don't want my friend to feel sad

Could you get help?

Yes, I could tell parents

Yes, I could tell the teachers

Block them

Call the police

Tell other friends / talk to them

Report it on the app

A girl is being pestered by a boy in her class saying that he likes her. He keeps blowing her kisses and he won't leave her alone. If the teachers heard or saw that happening, would they do anything?

Yes! They might talk to them on their own to discuss it with them and explain

All said that they would do something with 2/3rds saying they would be happy to act themselves and 1/3 preferring to go to the teacher
